GOVERNOR TAKING "CAPITAL FOR A DAY" TO ONEIDA COUNTY IN AUGUST

(BOISE) – Governor C.L. "Butch" Otter announced today that the **Oneida County community of Malad City** will host the next Capital for a Day on **Tuesday, August 14th**

Governor Otter brings State government to Idahoans living outside Boise each month by making a different town in Idaho the state's "Capital for a Day." The meetings provide local residents an all-day opportunity to have open discussions about government issues with Governor Otter, members of his Cabinet and other senior State officials.

The next Capital for a Day is scheduled from **9 a.m. to 3 p.m. at Malad High School in Malad City**. Governor Otter also will join local officials for a noon luncheon at the same location.

State officials joining Governor Otter at Capital for a Day will include **Lieutenant Governor Brad Little, Richard Westerberg of the State Board of Education, Department of Water Resources Director Gary Spackman, Idaho State Liquor Division Director Jeff Anderson; and Jim Unsworth, deputy director of the Idaho Department of Fish and Game.**

Also on hand will be senior representatives from the Idaho State Department of Agriculture, Department of Health and Welfare, Idaho Transportation Department, Idaho State Police, Department of Parks and Recreation, State Historical Society, and the Department of Labor.

"It's named for a lake in upstate New York, but Oneida County is about as uniquely Idaho as you can get. It's a land of pioneers who helped open this country and turn it from a frontier into a rich agricultural area offering space and opportunity for those tough enough to tame it," Governor Otter said. "Some of those early challenges continue today, but many of them have changed. I look forward to hearing from local folks about what makes their community special, and how we can help make it even better."
