WHEREAS, in 1872, J. Sterling Morton proposed that a special day be set aside for the planting of trees; and

WHEREAS, this holiday, called Arbor Day, was first observed with the planting of more than a million trees; and

WHEREAS, Arbor Day is observed throughout the nation and the world; and

WHEREAS, trees can reduce the erosion of top soil, clean the air, store carbon, produce oxygen, cut heating and cooling costs, and provide wildlife habitat and recreation opportunities; and

WHEREAS, working forests are a renewable and sustainable source of wood and paper products that are energy efficient and recyclable; and

WHEREAS, millions of seedlings are hand-planted in Idaho's forests annually in addition to the millions that nature plants; and

WHEREAS, working forests contribute to the economic, social and environmental wellbeing of Idaho's people and communities; and

WHEREAS, trees, wherever they are planted, are a source of joy and spiritual renewal;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, C.L. "BUTCH" OTTER, Governor of the State of Idaho, do hereby proclaim April 26, 2013 to be

ARBOR DAY

in Idaho, and I urge all citizens to celebrate this day in observance of the important role trees play in our daily lives and the renewability of this precious resource.
