WHEREAS, Taiwan and the state of Idaho are long-term partners in trade, investment, tourism, agriculture, education and cultural exchange; and

WHEREAS, there is frequent exchange between our governments, our citizens, our businesses and our students to the benefit of both sides; and

WHEREAS, the people of the Republic of China have developed strong and lasting bonds of friendship with the people of Idaho, and are increasing their influence and accomplishments in the international community; and

WHEREAS, Taiwan is celebrating its 103rd anniversary since its founding in 1911, and

WHEREAS, "Double Ten Day" has been annually observed as a special day for Taiwan in the state of Idaho;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, C.L. "Butch" Otter, Governor of the state of Idaho, do hereby proclaim Thursday, October 10, 2014 as

TAIWAN DOUBLE TEN DAY

in the state of Idaho, and I urge all citizens to salute the Taiwanese people in honor of the anniversary of this historic event.
