WHEREAS, Idaho has produced several well-respected, contemporary cowboy poets, and recognizing that the contributions of these poets dates as far back as cowboys themselves; and

WHEREAS, Idaho hosts major cowboy gatherings in Hagerman, St. Anthony, Montpelier, Fruitland and Rupert; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate to recognize the importance of cowboy poetry;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, C.L. "BUTCH" OTTER, Governor of the State of Idaho, do hereby proclaim the week of April 21-27, 2014 to be

COWBOY POETRY WEEK

in Idaho, and I urge all of Idaho's citizens to recognize and celebrate this occasion.
