WHEREAS, the men and women who have served in the armed forces of the United States of America have shown the highest level of citizenship and made major contributions through the defense of our great nation and the preservation of the freedoms we hold so dear; and

WHEREAS, the service performed by millions of gallant Americans, including thousands of Idahoans, demonstrates our citizens' willingness to meet the challenges from those who wish to subjugate our nation through armed conflict, including acts of terrorism; and

WHEREAS, on the 11th hour of the 11th day of November 1918, an armistice was signed ending World War I; and since that day plays such a significant part in our nation's heritage, November 11th of each year has been designated by Congress and the Idaho Legislature as Veterans Day; and

WHEREAS, Veterans Day is a day to recognize and honor the veterans of World War I and those millions who served our nation since that time whose military service has had a profound effect on history, and it is a day to rededicate ourselves to Abraham Lincoln's call "to care for him who shall have borne the battle, and for his widow and his orphan;" and

WHEREAS, Americans, Idahoans and all citizens of the free world celebrate the contributions of our veterans by honoring all who served and those who continue to serve, as well as those still listed as missing in action or as prisoners of war;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, C. L. "BUTCH" OTTER, Governor of Idaho, do hereby proclaim November 11, 2015, to be

VETERANS DAY

in Idaho, and I call upon all our citizens to observe this day with appropriate ceremonies in honor of our men and women who have served this country so valiantly to preserve the principles of justice, freedom and democracy; to fly the flag; and to visit all our veterans, especially those who are hospitalized, and let them know we appreciate their great sacrifices.
