WHEREAS, in 1926, Mr. Carter G. Woodson founded the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History in American Life; and

WHEREAS, the Mountain Home Community Black History Committee, created to commemorate and carry on this tradition, is celebrating its 22nd year of existence; and

WHEREAS, the theme of this year's Black History Month is "Dream with a Vision, Live with a Purpose"; and

WHEREAS, the Honorable Cherie Buckner-Webb is welcomed to Mountain Home as the first Black American elected to the Idaho State House of Representatives, District 19, Seat A, by popular vote on November 2, 2010 as the Mountain Home Community Black History Committee's 22st keynote speaker; and

WHEREAS, each year during Black History Month, we explore the history and culture of Black Americans, and we discover anew a treasure of history about the triumph of the human spirit; and

WHEREAS, Black history is an essential part of American history, and it is fitting that we set aside a special time to acknowledge this important segment of citizens of our state and our history;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, C.L. "BUTCH" OTTER, Governor of the State of Idaho, do hereby proclaim the month of February 2011, to be

in Idaho, and I encourage all citizens to be aware of important contributions made by Black citizens throughout our great state and thank them for the part they play in our society.
