Rett Syndrome Awareness Month

WHEREAS, Rett Syndrome is a devastating neurodevelopmental disorder caused by a sporadic, genetic mutation of the MECP2 gene on the X chromosome that mainly affects females; and

WHEREAS, every two hours a girl is born with Rett Syndrome, but its symptoms usually do not appear until six to 18 months later; and

WHEREAS, loss of the ability to speak, trouble walking, loss of hand control, seizures, scoliosis, and apraxia are some of the hallmarks of Rett Syndrome; and

WHEREAS, dedicated scientists and researchers from around the world are working hard to find a cure for Rett Syndrome, and in 2007 the discovery of a reversal of Rett Syndrome symptoms in mice showed positive results for finding suitable treatments; and

WHEREAS, it is important to continue our efforts in bringing Rett Syndrome awareness to the medical community, therapists, teachers, caregivers and the general public to encourage a world without Rett Syndrome;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, C.L. "BUTCH" OTTER, Governor of the State of Idaho, do hereby proclaim October 2011 to be

in Idaho.
