WHEREAS, our nation has benefited from the NAACP's unwavering commitment to civil rights and the vision of a society free from injustice; and

WHEREAS, beginning in 1919, Idaho members of the NAACP have been dedicated to upholding these principles of the NAACP and have worked to achieve the objectives of justice and equality for all;

WHEREAS, today, members of the Treasure Valley Branch of the NAACP are continuing in their efforts to end discrimination and to ensure equal opportunity for all the citizens of our state; and

WHEREAS, the state of Idaho and all its citizens have benefited from the dedication to these principles on the part of members of the Treasure Valley Branch of the NAACP and from their unwavering commitment to these goals;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, C.L. "Butch" Otter, Governor of the State of Idaho, do hereby proclaim October 1, 2011 as

in Idaho.
