WHEREAS, the citizens of Idaho desire to express their collective thanks and appreciation for those who have served and those who are presently serving;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, C.L. "BUTCH" OTTER, Governor of the State of Idaho, do hereby proclaim September 11, 2011 to be
