### **GOVERNOR OTTER SETS APRIL CAPITAL FOR A DAY IN BOUNDARY COUNTY**

(BOISE) –Governor C.L. "Butch" Otter announced today that his next Capital for a Day will be **Friday, April 25th**, in the **Boundary County seat of Bonners Ferry**.

Governor Otter brings State government to Idahoans living outside Boise each month by making a different town in Idaho the state's "Capital for a Day." The meetings provide local residents an opportunity to have open discussions about government issues and public policy with Governor Otter, members of his Cabinet and other senior State officials.

The Capital for a Day on April 25th is scheduled from **9 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the Boundary County Fairgrounds in Bonners Ferry**. Governor Otter also will join local officials and residents at noon for a no-host lunch at the same location.

State officials joining Governor Otter at Capital for a Day will include **Lieutenant Governor Brad Little, State Superintendent of Public Instruction Tom Luna, Department of Fish and Game Director Virgil Moore, Idaho Transportation Department Director Brian Ness, Idaho Division of Veterans Services Administrator David Brasuell, and Office of Species Conservation Administrator Dustin Miller**. Also on hand to answer questions will be representatives from the Idaho Tax Commission, Idaho Department of Lands, Idaho Department of Health and Welfare, and Idaho Department of Environmental Quality.

"My first Capital for a Day was in Boundary County, in January 2007. We've been all over the state since then, a couple of times over, and it will be good to revisit the people and the issues we discussed seven years ago with our friends in Idaho's northernmost county," Governor Otter said. "It might seem like a world away from Boise, but that's why this program is so important: The citizens here have every bit as much right to interact directly with their elected leaders as those who live down the street from the Capitol. I'm looking forward to it."
