EXECUTIVE ORDER No. 2026-03

DECLARING IDAHO'S INTENT TO OPT-IN TO THE FEDERAL SCHOLARSHIP TAX CREDIT PROGRAM

WHEREAS, on July 4, 2025, President Trump signed H.R.1 – the One Big Beautiful Bill Act – which created a federal tax credit for individuals who wish to support K-12 students by donating up to \$1,700 to a qualified scholarship granting organization (SGO); and

WHEREAS, this tax credit provides Idaho with a great opportunity to expand educational opportunities for all students without placing any additional burden on taxpayers; and

WHEREAS, to take advantage of this new program beginning in January 2027, states must first opt in; and

WHEREAS, on January 20, 2026, Idaho officially submitted IRS Form 15714 declaring our intention to participate in the program and acknowledging that we must next provide a list of qualified SGOs that meet the requirements described in section 25F(c)(5) of the Internal Revenue Code; and

WHEREAS, as a leader in school choice, Idaho welcomes the opportunity to participate and looks forward to receiving further implementation guidance from the Internal Revenue Service; and

NOW THEREFORE, I, Brad Little, Governor of the State of Idaho, pursuant to the Constitution and laws of Idaho, do hereby order:

1. The Idaho State Department of Education to prepare to implement the new education tax credit as provided for in the One Big Beautiful Bill Act.
 - a. The Idaho State Department of Education shall:
 - i. By the first day of January of each year, submit to the Secretary of the Treasury of the United States and publish on its website a list of qualified scholarship granting organizations located in the state.
 - ii. Certify its own authority to submit such list.
 - iii. Accept submissions from scholarship granting organizations throughout the year to determine their qualifications for inclusion on the list submitted annually.
 - iv. Comply with any other applicable federal regulations or guidance to ensure that the state is eligible to participate in taxable years beginning after December 31, 2026.
